The Audio and Visual team has taken us so from recording the services to live streaming to Zoom services, Zoom Sunday school, and Zoom Book clubs.

Our committee and vestry meetings have continued online, which for a majority have been a blessing because it has been easier to accommodate with our busy personal schedules. We all owe a big Thank you to Steve MacFarland, Amanda Livermont, Jim Stallings, Jay Jones, Mindy Barringer, Father Tommy, and Kyle Osbourne for all their hard work and long hours they have put into this ministry of the parish.

Mother Liz formed an advisory counsel made up of parishioners who work in the medical and hazardous materials fields to advise the vestry on how to keep our members safe. Judith Kimsey, a Vestry member put together a project plan for how we would handle every step of reopening the campus from the purchasing of cleaning supplies to parking spaces and everything in between.

As many of you know we finished the year with a deficit of \$44,580.00 and unfortunately in January 2021 we had a deficit of \$8,416.00. As has been said many times before, we have reduced our expenses down as much as we can if we continue in this trend the Vestry will have to make some very hard decisions in 2021.
